This workshop offers an *experience* of healing for traumatized people and their families. Its 3-dimensional design provides education for the mind, safety for the heart, and courage to develop a new relationship with weariness in the soul. Participants will learn how to re-own and rehome scattered pieces of self by cultivating *personal* intimacy with the part of self carrying emotional pain. Connecting with the part of self generating the pain, paradoxically, restores wholeness. Facilitation will also include a physician, Dr. Abi Katz, and secondary trauma specialist Kathy Van Pelt.
